

# **Directors Re-Elected To New Terms At 2011 Hardy Annual Meeting**

Hardy Telecommunications thanks everyone who came to our 2011 Annual Meeting of Members on Friday, October 7, in the East Hardy High School gymnasium.

and Lost River serving area 3, respectively.

Two directors were re-elected to new three-year terms at the meeting. Those directors reelected were Loring E. Barr, representing South Fork serving area 1; and Victoria O. Dyer, representing Lost River serving area 3. Both were unopposed in their bids for re-election.

During the meeting, General Manager Scott Sherman reported on various company projects in the past year, including Greg Zirk Hardy Tel's new President of the Board of Directors.



Hardy's OneNet Fiber-tothe-Home project, which will enable Hardy for the first time to offer high-definition digital television, much faster Internet speeds and digital voice services. The construction will take three years, but the first residents should begin receiving service in late summer 2012.

During a board meeting immediately following the

meeting, President Phyllis Cook indicated that she planned to step down from the presidency title she has had for two decades. Greg Zirk, who has represented Moorefield serving area 2 on the board since 2006, officially took over as Hardy Telecommunications' President of the Board of Directors at the group's monthly meeting on October 25. Phyllis is still a member of the board.

# Hardy Names Contractors, Begins Construction Of Fiber Network

Construction began September 26, 2011, on Hardy Telecommunications' fiberoptic network ring that will connect vital institutions throughout Hardy County.

The work will continue throughout the winter as weather permits. The ring will reach government buildings, medical offices, educational facilities, emergency response departments and other anchor institutions.

Hardy named ER Excavating & Utilities, LLC, and Gudenkauf Corporation as the contractors for the project, said Hardy Telecommunications Marketing and Human Resource Director Derek Barr.

Both companies will be operating under the direction of Byers Engineering, an Atlanta-based consulting firm hired by Hardy to oversee the fiber projects. Byers has been instrumental throughout the entire process of designing the fiber networks and securing federal funding. Byers has opened a local office at 500 Spring St. in Moorefield for the duration of the projects, which in total are expected to take about three years.

The fiber network ring is the first step in a three-year process that ultimately will bring fiber-optic connections directly to residents' homes in Hardy County. Hardy

Telecommunications then will be able to offer high-definition digital television, faster Internet speeds and digital voice services.

Derek stressed that the fiber network ring connecting the county's anchor institutions is an entire project in itself and is not designed to build fiber out to individual resident homes; that is a separate project called OneNet. ER Excavating and Gudenkauf were named for the AnchorRing project only. Hardy Telecommunications has not started the bid process for the construction of the Hardy OneNet network. That process will be announced at a later date.

Hardy AnchorRing must be completed first, and then Hardy OneNet will extend the fiber-optic connections to individual premises. In the telecommunications industry, AnchorRing is called a "middle-mile" project while OneNet is a "last-mile" project.

AnchorRing is being funded by the federal National Telecommunications and Information Administration's broadband stimulus program through a \$3.2 million grant in combination with an \$814,000 cash contribution from Hardy.

### Hardy Apologizes, Seeks Explanation For Late Customer Bills
