While on the Youth Tour, students and chaperones will:

- Tour famous historical sites and monuments, including Arlington National Cemetery, Mt. Vernon, Lincoln Memorial, Vietnam Veterans Memorial, and World War II Memorial
- Visit Smithsonian Museums
- Meet with Federal Communications Commission and Congressional staff
- Attend a play at the Kennedy Center
- Build relationships with peers that can last a lifetime
- Develop leadership skills
